9.1 NBHEA-ANBEF Bathurst Chapter Report

Four Chapter meeting were held in 2016-2017: June 8, October 6, December 6, and March 25 for a new experience, “Célébrations de nos différences “(Celebrate our differences). We met with women from Syria when they came to their English classes given by the NB Community College in Bathurst. Seven of these meetings were held as a foods classes plus two with food preparation at the Centre Dawson in Bathurst. With the help of the NBCC, the committee organized a traditional Christmas dinner December 15, 2016 for approximately 60 persons.

It was decided not to continue this project for different reasons: first, we did not get the grant from the Canada 150 Fund and we realized that the project was not the Syrian’s priority. Learning the language is more important to them and we understand. Certain families have already moved. The Committee members are ready to be involved with other activities to intergrate the Syrians families in our community.

Our NBHEA-ANBEF president has kept us informed with the different actions taken to keep the two programs offering majors in « études familiales » (Family Studies) at l'Université de Moncton.

Jolaine Thomas will present her final report to the Chapter members. The project consisted of identifying potential jobs opportunities for Professional Home Economists in the region.

Annie Thériault, EFI, teacher at l'École Népisiquit, presented the new NBHEA-ANBEF banner to her students. It was well received and good suggestions were made to improve it.

Barbara Lordly
1928-2017



Barbara was a graduate of the first class who completed the two-year Home Economics Education Program in 1948 using the facilities at the Saint John Vocational School. Rheta Inch was instrumental for having organized the

curriculum and taught part of the courses, especially clothing and textiles. After doing several summer school courses, Barbara decided to attend Pennsylvania State University as a full-time student where she obtained a B.Sc. in Home Economics in 1954.

Her first teaching position was in Dalhousie. When she came back to NB after her studies in the USA, she taught in Sackville, NB for one year and then joined the staff of the new Simonds High School in Saint John, where she taught home economics until her retirement in 1984. The students of Simonds High School held a special place in her heart.

She was active with the Canadian Federation of University Women, New Brunswick Home Economic Association, New Brunswick Retired Teachers Association, and the Photography and Travel Club. She had a keen interest in gardening, canoeing, and kayaking on the Kennebecasis, photography, world travel, and was an excellent seamstress.

Barbara passed away on April 6, 2017.

Ruby Jean MacNeil 1919-2017



On March 6, 2017, the New Brunswick Home Economics Association lost a longtime and very supportive member, Ruby Jean MacNeil. Born and educated in Summerside, PEI, Ruby always considered herself an “island girl” and returned each summer to her cottage at Stanley Bridge where her door was always open for visitors.

After attending an accredited High School in Summerside, Ruby observed that many dieticians and Home Economists were offered interesting employment opportunities. This motivated her to enroll at Acadia University, the same university her mother attended, where she graduated with a BSc in Household Economics in 1941. It was wartime, and although she

was encouraged to further her studies at Cornell, with money scarce, Ruby decided to enter the work force.

With her diploma in hand, she accepted a position as an Agricultural Assistant at the Consumer Department of Agriculture Canada in Ottawa. A level 2 Home Economist was paid \$ 1,200 annually. At the time Laura Pepper, Estelle LeBlanc (from NB) and Miss Elliott were also working at the Department.

After this experience, Ruby started her education career. In the beginning she taught at the Ontario Ladies College in Whitby, outside of Toronto, which was a private school with approximately 125 boarders and then at Acadia University where she taught Foods and Nutrition to first year students.

While attending her first CHEA conference in Digby, N.S., Ruby learned from Miss Elliott that scholarships were available for students at Macdonald College associated with McGill University in Montreal. She applied to do her Master's Degree in Nutrition and earned a \$750 fellowship while working as a teaching assistant during her second year.

In 1948, Regional High Schools were being built in PEI and they needed Home Economics teachers. Ruby returned to her hometown and accepted a position at Summerside High School as the first Home Economics teacher to grades 7 to 12 until 1950.

Having been offered a teaching position at Princess Elizabeth School, in Saint John, Ruby came to New Brunswick in 1950. During an interview with an NBHEA member, she told of her arrival in Saint John: 'After flying to Moncton and taking the bus to Saint John, I met with the superintendent and signed my contract. Then he informed me that there was a meeting for all the vocational teachers being held in Moncton. So I returned to Moncton the same day.'

In 1957 she was appointed as Supervisor of Home Economics for the Saint John school district and held this position until her retirement in 1978. During this time Ruby had the foresight to ensure that her teachers were kept abreast of the latest developments in Home Economics and she always encouraged them to continue their education and professional development.

Although she continued to live in Saint John after her retirement, Ruby continued to be interested in the advancements in the field of Home Economics. She loved to travel, meet people and take photos often after attending International Federation of Home Economics Conferences. Blessed with a sharp memory, she was an inspiration to many friends and colleagues as she recounted her adventures during those travels. She attended NBHEA Conferences well into her early 90's. She gladly shared her incredible wealth of Home Economics knowledge throughout her career and retirement.

Ruby was a gentle and interesting lady – a Home Economist, teacher, District Co-ordinator, and an active member of many organizations: Canadian Federation of University Women, International Federation on Home Economics, Canadian Home Economics Association until

the end. She was active in both the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Home Economics Associations.

To so many of us she was an inspiration, mentor and friend. This was clearly shown by the large attendance at the celebration of her life in Saint John on March 11, 2017.
